## INTEGRATE PRAYER INTO EVERY SESSION

HELP STUDENTS BOTH UNDERSTAND AND LIVE OUR FAITH	PRAYER SHOULD ALWAYS BE INTENTIONAL AND MEANINGFUL Don't neglect prayer, rush prayer or make it an afterthought. Our children need to learn the devotional and reverent practice of prayer to engage in a relationship with Christ
	"LEX ORANDI, LEX CREDENDI"
	This is a Latin saying that means when we pray, we live out what we believe. Spend time contemplating the words of prayer and allowing students to discover their prayer style.
TEACH THEM	ALL TO OFTEN WE ONLY TEACH THE WORDS AND NEGLECT THE MEANING
THE MEANING OF THE WORDS OF OUR FAITH	ASK YOUR STUDENTS WHAT WORDS THEY DO NOT UNDERSTAND Simplify difficult words and help them put the words in to context
	WORK ON YOUR OWN TONE, PACE, AND DELIVERY TO MODEL HEALTHY PRAYER
	TO YOUR STUDENTS
	Consider how you can say the words of common prayers to evoke more meaning INVITE CRITICAL THINKING
	What does that mean? Are you living the words you are praying?
SHARE YOUR	SHARE HOW PRAYER HAS IMPACTED YOUR LIFE
STORY	The best way we teach young people about God is to let them see that God is alive and well in our own lives and that we are made better by our relationship with God!
