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Praying with the Blessed Sacrament

From the very beginning of the Christian story, the Eucharist has been central. It has been called the Source and Summit of the Christian Life. Through the celebration of the Mass, we come to a deeper union with Christ, our Lord and Savior.

But our prayer with the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament does not have to end with the Mass. One true gift of our Church is that this meal for the journey is also the companion on our journey.

Through time spent in prayer with Christ we come to a deeper sense of ourselves. And yet, when one begins praying before the Blessed Sacrament it can be difficult to find a way. It can sometimes be a struggle to know what to say or how to present oneself to the Divine Creator.

This book of prayers is meant to help you find a place to start. It is in no way a definitive collection of prayers, nor is it meant to replace time spent in quiet. It is simply a tool to help you start your time with Jesus.

As St. Alphonsus Liguori observed, "Know also that you will probably gain more by praying fifteen minutes before the Blessed Sacrament than by all the other spiritual exercises of the day."



Our Father

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed by Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Apostles' Creed

The Real Presence of Jesus

St. Francis of Assisi (1181-1226)

A Prayer for Deliverance

St. Theresa of Calcutta (1910-1997)

From the desire of being loved, From the desire of being extolled, From the desire of being honored, From the desire of being praised, From the desire of being preferred, From the desire of being consulted, From the desire of being approved, From the desire of being popular, From the fear of being humiliated From the fear of being despised, From the fear of suffering rebukes, From the fear of being culminated, From the fer of being forgotten, From the fear of being wronged, From the fear of being ridiculed, From the fear of being suspected.

Prayer from the Coptic Liturgy

Edward Caswall (1814-1878)

Acts of Spiritual Communion

St. Alphonsus Liguori (1696-1787) My Jesus, I believe that you are truly present in the most Blessed Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire to possess you within my soul. Since I am unable now to receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as being already there, and unite myself wholly to you. Never, never permit me to be separated from you.

St. Francis of Assisi (1181-1226)

I believe that You, O Jesus, are in the most holy Sacrament. I love You and desire You. Come into my heart. I embrace You. Oh, never leave me. May the burning and most sweet power of your love, O Lord Jesus Christ, I beseech You, absorb my mind that I may die through love of Your love, who were graciously pleased to die through love of my love.

Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction

EXPOSITION—After the people have assembled, the following hymn is sung while the Priest or Deacon incenses the Most Blessed Sacrament. (Cf. The Order of Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction, no. 93).

O Victim bringing saving grace,	O salutáris Hóstia,
who open wide the gate of heav'n:	quae caeli pandis óstium,

ADORATION—It is desirable that a sacred silence occur at suitable times. The Liturgy of the Hours may be celebrated during the period of exposition, or there may be prayers, songs, readings from Scripture and a brief homily, so the faithful, attentive in prayer, may devote themselves to Christ the Lord. (Cf. The Order of Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction, nos. 95-96).

BENEDICTION—Toward the end of Adoration, the Priest or Deacon approaches the altar, genuflects and kneels, and the following hymn is sung. (Cf. The Order of Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction, no. 97).

Let us therefore, bow and worship, such a wondrous Sacrament; let the ancient law and custom to a newer rite now yield; let our faith supply conviction where the senses tire and fail.

To the Father, unbegotten, and the Sole-begotten Son, be salvation, blessing, honor jubilation, pow'r, and praise; to the One from both proceeding equal glory and renown. Amen. Tantum ergo Sacraméntum venerémur cérnui, et antíquum documéntum novo cedat rítui; praestet fides suppleméntum, sénsuum deféctui.

Genitóri Genitóque laus et jubilátio, salus, honor, virtus quoque sit et benedíctio; procedénti ab utróque compar sit laudátio. Amen.

Let us pray. O God, Who in this wonderful Sacrament have left us aw memorial of your Passion, grant us, we pray, so to revere the sacred mysteries of your Body and Blood that we may always experience in ourselves the fruits of your redemption. Who live and reign for ever and ever. Amen.

EUCHARISTIC BLESSING—Once the prayer has been said, the Priest or Deacon puts on a humeral veil, genuflects, and takes the monstrance and, with it, makes the Sign of the Cross over the people, without saying anything. A minister may incense the Most Blessed Sacrament. Before the blessing, a prayer such as the following may be said.

ACCLAMATION—The following acclamation may be sung or said in unison before placing the Most Blessed Sacrament back in the tabernacle:

REPOSITION—After the blessing, the Priest or Deacon places the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle while the people sing:

Holy God, we praise thy name; Lord of all, we bow before thee; All on earth thy scepter claim, All in heaven above adore thee. Infinite thy vast domain, Everlasting is thy reign. Hark, the loud celestial hymn; Angel choirs above are raising; Cherubim and Seraphim, In unceasing chorus praising, Fill the heavens with sweet accord: Holy, holy, holy, Lord!



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
