



- NCYC (National Catholic Youth Conference) is a powerfully unique three-day experience of prayer, community, evangelization, catechesis, service, and empowerment for Catholic teenagers (of high school age) and their adult chaperones.
- NCYC dates to 1983 when it started as a regional conference. It is now the premier Catholic youth event on a national scale. NCYC is offered every year, alternating between Indianapolis, Indiana and Long Beach, California. NCYC 2024 is Long Beach and NCYC 2025, as you can see, is in Indianapolis.



- All of these venues are conveniently located right next to each other.
- Keynote sessions and the massive closing Mass at the end of the conference take place in Lucas Oil Stadium (Home of the Indianapolis Colts). All other conference opportunities take place in the convention center.
- St. John the Evangelist is not an official conference venue, but the church works with conference organizers to open its doors to NCYC pilgrims for additional Mass and prayer opportunities.




TRANSPORTATION

- We travel to/from the conference via bus.
- We work with Anderson Coach & Travel out of Greenville, PA, a company that we have worked with for many years.
- Their staff is great to work with. They have drivers that continually request to drive for us when we go to the conference.
- Buses depart from several locations on the afternoon (2:00-5:00 p.m.) prior to the start of the conference. In the case of NCYC 2025, this would be Wednesday, November 19.
- Departure locations will depend on parishes are grouped on the buses and may require a short drive from where your parish is located.



- Conference organizers work with major hotel brands to reserve rooms at hotels in Indianapolis, many of which are within walking distance of the conference venues.
- Our office will complete the process to be assigned a hotel later this fall/early 2025.



- Here is an idea of what the schedule for the first day of the conference might look like.
- We hope to have either a diocesan Mass or New York State regional Mass during the conference. In 2023, we were blessed to celebrate Mass as a diocesan delegation at St. John the Evangelist, which we hadn't done before.

NCYC 2025 FAQ's


- Who can attend NCYC?
 - (NCYC) is open to all high school aged youth and their adult chaperones.
- How many people attend NCYC?
 - In 2023, there were 12,071 attendees, 242 priests and deacons, 22 bishops, and 130 exhibitors.
- What is included in the NCYC pilgrimage package?
 - The package will include the official NCYC Registration Fee, hotel, breakfast, diocesan swag, bus transportation to/from the conference, and more.
- Is there financial assistance for NCYC?
 - Financial assistance is available through the Diocese and the National Federation for Catholic Youth Ministry (NFCYM), the organizers of NCYC. Parishes also conduct fundraising to defray some of the costs.



• Make sure to include any current 8th graders in your NCYC conversations. They will be 9th graders in November 2025.




- There are three registration periods.
- The first registration period has the lowest cost for the pilgrimage.
- The total cost for the pilgrimage is broken down into a non-refundable deposit and two payments.
- We may not get to all registration periods as we limit the number of pilgrimage spaces.
- If all spaces are full, we will utilize a waitlist.



Finances Broken Down

- Financial assistance is available through the Diocese and NFCYM.
 - Each pilgrim who applied for financial assistance through the Diocese for NCYC 2023 received <u>50% OR MORE</u> of the amount requested.
- Parishes also conduct fundraising to defray some of the costs.
 - Office of Evangelization & Catechesis provides guidance on how to conduct successful fundraising that is in line with diocesan policies.
- The process to apply for diocesan financial assistance is very easy and pilgrims have plenty of time to complete the necessary steps to be considered for it.
- For NCYC 2023, only 8% of our young people applied for diocesan financial assistance. The Bishop Clark Youth Advocacy Fund can help support more youth pilgrims than it did in 2023.
- Please make sure to have a conversation with your finance director and pastor as
 you begin planning fundraising efforts. How we approach financially supporting and
 fundraising for opportunities like NCYC has changed in recent years, so these
 conversations are important!
